CALL FOR ENTRIES

Judging Criteria

All entries are judged on merit, regardless of scale or budget. Projects will be judged individually, based on stated design challenges, and the responding design solution. The Jury will review design submittals for the following project categories:

Residential	Landscape Architecture
Commercial	Historic Preservation
Recreational	Adaptive Reuse
Institutional	Unbuilt Work
Educational	Student Work
Interior Architecture	20-Year Award
Urban Design	Firm Award

In collaboration with the US Green Building Council – Inland Empire Chapter, projects submitted within all design categories will be eligible for judging for the Sustainable Design Award category and will be judged from the entries received. Entries must include a written narrative and a sustainable design checklist enumerating the applicable credits.

Entry submittals must be received at the AIAIC office by 5:00 PM on Friday, March 27, 2009.

Awards will be announced at the Design Awards Presentation Dinner during the 2009 Architecture Week on Wednesday, April 22, 2009 (Earth Day). The event will be co-sponsored and will be hosted at the Riverside Art Museum. An award will be presented to the Project Team for each award-winning submittal. Submission Format

Each project must be submitted as follows:

1. 1 – 20" x 30" presentation board (1/2" foam core)(1 per project).
2. SpineVue® ShowFile™ Display Book with Wraparound Spine Pocket (12 sleeves, black) with the completed information form inserted in an envelope and inside one of the binder sleeves. These binders are available at most office supply stores. Each submission should include a narrative (200 words maximum) describing the project. An additional narrative/checklist is required for those submittals seeking judging under the sustainable category. Supporting visual images should include 8½" x 11" high quality photographs, digital images and drawings that allow for a comprehensive evaluation of the project, including site plan, Floor Plan(s), Exterior Elevations and any other diagrams required to explain the project.
3. Two copies of a CD or DVD containing a power point presentation including all the images contained in the binder for each submission and the narrative in PDF format. The complete submission information form must be placed inside a blank envelope taped to the back of the CD or DVD cover.



RIVERSIDE ART MUSEUM

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No identification of the architect or project designer, building, or owner shall appear on any of the visual images submitted, with the exception of permanent signs affixed to the building.

AIAIC will only accept entries that comply with the submittal format criteria.

Eligibility

- A. The 2009 AIAIC Design Award program is open to all design professionals practicing in the San Bernardino and Riverside counties. It is not necessary to be an AIA member.
- B. All AIA Inland California Chapter Members, who are in good standing with the AIA, may submit projects designed, built or commissioned anywhere.
- C. All AIA members of other Chapters, who are in good standing with the AIA, may submit projects that have been built or commissioned in San Bernardino and Riverside counties.
- D. Members of the APA, the ULI and the ASLA may submit projects that have been built or commissioned in San Bernardino and Riverside counties.
- E. Architects, Landscape Architects, Urban Designers and Planners who are not AIA members may submit projects that have been built or commissioned in San Bernardino and Riverside counties.
- F. Architecture students from Southern California colleges and Universities may submit student projects.

Exclusions

Built Projects must have been completed as of January 2006. Projects not yet built should be commissioned with an expected construction start date no later than February, 2010. All submittals must be designed by the entrant.

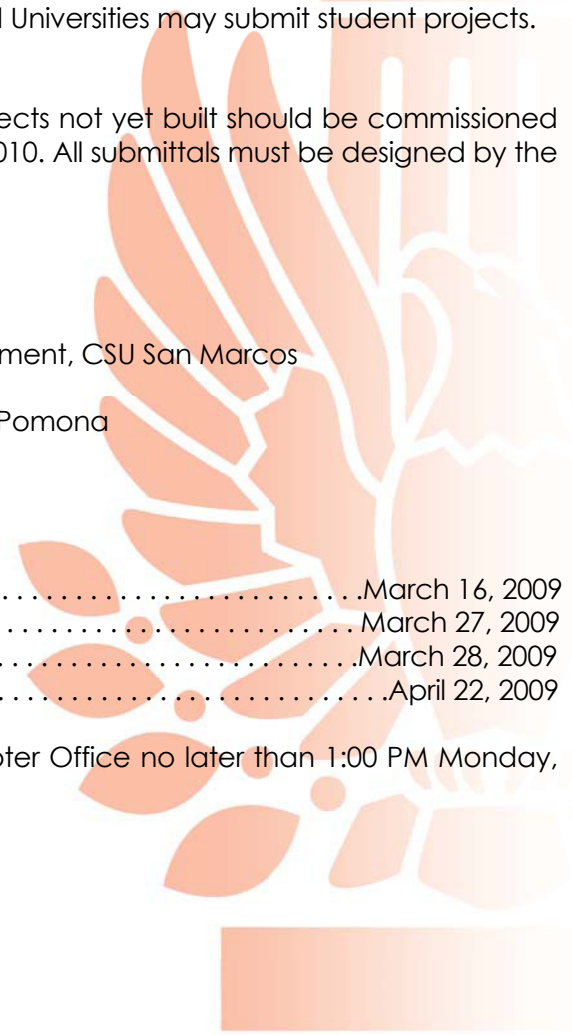
